MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:

2023 was another year of great moment for CBE!

Let me explain: After overcoming the infamous Covid pandemic, we restarted our engines at full speed, both in carrying out our extensive national and international sports calendar and in our athletes' participation in various international events with unprecedented achievements. In the same vein, we have continued to make significant administrative progress, as well as important political achievements, in order to bring major international championships to Brazil in the coming years, such as the 2024 Pan American Cadet and Youth Championships, the 2025 Senior Pan American Fencing Championship and, finally, the 2026 Junior & Cadet Fencing World Championships.

On the technical side, I must highlight our unprecedented gold medal won by the Women's Épée team at the Pan American Games in Santiago. We achieved many other international victories in all the weapons and categories, from youth to veterans, showing that the technical quality of Brazilian athletes is improving year after year. In Paralympic fencing, our top athletes traveled the world to various international events, achieving impressive results and scoring crucial points in the IWAS ranking in their quest for the much-desired qualification for the 2024 Paralympic Games.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Our national and international sports event calendar continues to grow and improve. In 2023, CBE held an impressive 23 national competitions, with 20 in the Olympic fencing and 3 in Paralympic fencing. Additionally, in Olympic fencing, we hosted the following international events in Brazil: the Cadet and Junior Men's Foil World Cup in São Paulo, the Senior Men's and Women's Foil Satellite in São Paulo, and the South American Championship for Youth and Veterans in Curitiba, PR. In Paralympic fencing, we held the Satellite Tournament in São Paulo in all the weapons.

We also participated in the Gymnasiáde in partnership with the Brazilian School Sports Confederation (CBDE) and, for the first time in our history, we took part in the Youth Games, organized by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB).

As part of our plan for youth development, in 2023, we held two national training camps for our young talents, one in São Paulo and another in Rio de Janeiro. In partnership with the Paraná Fencing Federation (FEP), we hosted for the third year running in Curitiba, PR, a training camp for young and adult Épée athletes led by Italian Master D'Armas Filippo Lombardo, and a Sabre camp under the guidance of Master D'Armas Alkhas Lakerbai.

Our Brazilian Fencing Institute (IBE) continued its mission, training Level I and II- coaches in Rio de Janeiro and Level II-coaches in São Paulo. Through, IBE organized an unprecedented armory course in São Paulo. In the idea of promoting our sport even more, we partnered with the e-Sports Museum, where fencing has its own exclusive gallery in this virtual, interactive, and interactive space with lots of 3D technology. We took part in the COB EXPO in São Paulo, a fantastic exhibition initiative by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) to present Olympic sports to the sports industry. At this grand event, we partnered with the São Paulo Fencing Federation (FPE) and several High-Performance Sports Centers (EPDs), whose coaches and athletes enriched our participation by presenting fencing to the thousands of visitors in attendance.

CBEsgrima TV has already established itself as a success! We are reaching an ever-growing and more interactive audience; at the same time, we continue to invest in better equipment for broadcasting our events and new content in various programs.

Once again, with a focus on constantly improving our governance, CBE nominated three students to the prestigious Advanced Sports Management Course (CAGE) by COB. This year, the participants are the President of the Paraná Fencing Federation (FEP), Ildefonso Petrich, the President of the São Paulo Fencing Federation (FPE), Maurício Vianna and CBE's Financial Director, Alefer Santos

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly of the Brazilian Fencing Confederation is composed of seven distinct members: the President of the Entity, the Presidents of the State Federations of Rio de Janeiro, Paraná, São Paulo, and Rio Grande do Sul, one representative of the athletes, and one representative of the Sports Practice Entities (EPDs), all of whom have voting rights. This collegial body represents the highest authority of the entity, responsible for making crucial decisions that guide the course of our sport.

The year was set by a series of activities for the members of the CBE General Assembly. In addition to the ordinary sessions held at the beginning of the year, during which members gather to review the accounts of the previous fiscal year, and the sessions in the last quarter, in which the technical, budgetary, and administrative plans are evaluated, elections were held for members of the Fiscal and Ethics Councils. As provided in our statute, these elections must occur in different years from the executive elections. Therefore, on March 31, 2023, the Assembly approved the winners of the election, as well as validated the entire electoral process.

In the course of the same year, a new election was necessary due to the resignation of one of the Ethics Council members. A new call was made, and once again, the General Assembly verified and ratified the result of this extraordinary election.

In addition to this, 2023 was a significant moment with the recognition of the Minas Gerais Fencing Federation. After going through our Board of Directors' scrutiny, its affiliation was approved by the Assembly, thus expanding the state representation within the confederation.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS

One of the first activities of 2023 for the Board of Directors was to compose an Electoral Commission in order to comply with § 5, Article 30 of the Statute of the Brazilian Fencing Confederation, once the elections for the Entity's Fiscal and Ethics Councils were scheduled. Mr. Ildefonso Petrich, Mr. Thiago Antônio Soares Pinto and Mr. Guilherme Giffoni have been appointed as members of this special committee. This commission must validate the entire election process, checking from the acceptance of candidates to the counting of votes.

In May, the board met to recognize, to bind and to affiliate entities, namely: Associação D' Eficiência Superando Limites – ADESUL, Grupo de Ajuda dos Amigos Deficientes de Indaiatuba – GAADIN, Associação Paradesportiva de Integração Nauru Apim, Associação dos Deficientes Físicos de Pilar – ADEFIP, Romão Gomes Esgrima Treinamento e Assessoria Ltda, Dourado Esgrima Club, and Federação Mineira de Esgrima.

In September and December, the Board of Directors dealt with monitoring and controlling the strategic map, its pillars based on management, education and culture, sports development, high sports performance, image and engagement and their interconnections in strategic objectives such as improving governance and administrative management, developing human resources, developing the sport, achieving top 8 placements in the Olympic/Paralympic Games, and representing the entity internationally.

Having reviewed the goals, those responsible for their measurement, and frequency, the Board concluded that the program was aligned and that the objectives were being achieved.





SUPERVISORY BOARD

The year 2023 for the CBE was also marked by elections, with the Fiscal Council being one of the collegiate bodies participating in this process. We had a total of five candidates, and after the vote count, Jean C. Brunswick, Paulo José I. Morais, and Flávia de A. Foschin were elected, with Saulo G. Rodrigues as the alternate member.

Given this preliminary in line with its internal regulations and within its statutory duties, the Audit Board held its regular meetings. The first, on February 1st, 2023, had the attributes of judging the last quarter of 2022 and implementing a new meeting schedule for the current year. On April 26th, 2023, Jean C. Brunswick was elected by his peers as President of the Board. On that occasion, the Finance Director Alefer Correa and manager Eduardo Azeredo presented the systems used for financial management, subdividing them into the resources coming from the Brazilian Olympic Committee and the Brazilian Paralympic Committee to the new members. Finally, own resources, which are the amounts obtained through monthly and annual fees from EPDs and athlete registrations for competitions.

In July, the board met to analyze the accounts for the first quarter. In September, on the 20th, another meeting was held, now to consider the accounts for April, May and June, and then, in November, the last meeting of the year was held, dealing with the amounts for July, August and September.

Other advances were made by the collegiate board, such as the implementation of its own corporate e-mail - conselhofiscal@cbesgrima.org.br - , access to the Integrated Sports and Financial Management System (SIGEF), which manages the lottery funds decentralized by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB), the Agreement Management System (SGC), adopted by the Brazilian Paralympic Committee, as well as D4Sign, an electronic signature system that has been adapted to monitor and pay for all the entity's financial transactions.

ETHICS BOARD



As with the Fiscal Board, the Ethics Board was also on the ballot for a new group. The candidates were Ana Paula Dimitrow Gracia Pereira Portugal, Heros Augusto Santos Lobo and Suzana Pasternak Kuzolitz. Three candidates for the same number of vacancies. Despite these terms, they all received votes, ratifying their candidacies.

Ana Paula Dimitrow Gracia Pereira Portugal, who had been elected President of the Council, asked to withdraw from the college for personal reasons. A new election was held to fill this vacancy and the included candidates were Mr. Gerson Galleazzi, Mr. Pablo dos Santos Ferreira and Mr. Paulo Cesar Meine Morais. After counting the votes, the Electoral Commission declared Mr. Gerson Galleazzi the winner, and he was duly sworn in the following day, making up the full number of members of the Ethics Council.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

2023 was a fast-paced year, like the entire Olympic cycle. We had a shortened preparation period due to the Tokyo 2020 Olympic/Paralympic Games in 2021. The preparation began with a thorough analysis of our main athletes and teams, taking into account not only the world stage, but also our opponents on the American continent, since part of the qualification places for the Paris Games are in that region.

The Brazilian Fencing Confederation has continued to build the capacity of its managers, either through initiatives by the Brazilian Olympic Committee, by its Brazilian Olympic Institute (IOB), the Brazilian Paralympic Committee, by its Paralympic Academy, or through internal actions carried out by the Brazilian Fencing Institute (IBE), the educational arm of our organization. We would like to highlight the following points in this governance formation process:

At IOB, three fencing representatives were included in the Advanced Course in Financial and Sport Management (CAGE). Five employees took part in the Annual Managers' Meeting. The IBE Coordinator Rodrigo Fontes took part in the Coach Developers Training Program, aimed at training professionals with the necessary skills to plan, conduct and evaluate national coach development initiatives and programs. In addition, our staffs participated extensively in the course "Balancing the Game: Gender Equality in Sport".



ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

At the Paralympic Academy, executives from the affiliated confederations took part in a Corporate Governance course run by the Brazilian Institute of Corporate Governance (IBGC), one of the main references in the Brazilian and world markets. Our Confederation was represented by the President Ricardo Machado.

The Brazilian Fencing Institute held a series of talks in 2023 for its employees, covering current and dynamic topics such as Mental Health in the Workplace, Effective Communication, Seven Keys to a Successful Team and Personal Branding. In addition to his, the Financial Director Alefer Correia presented the case about Sports Entity Management, part of his CAGE's projects.

We would also like to highlight the start of the knowledge pills project "da Esquiva ao Toque", an ongoing training program designed to offer quality learning concisely and accurately.

In 2023, 136 projects were carried out with resources from the Lottery Law, 90 of which were decentralized by the Brazilian Olympic Committee and 46 through agreements with the Brazilian Paralympic Committee. We had never ever before handled so many resources, marking significant technical, administrative and financial growth for CBE.

FEDERATIONS AND ATHLETES

We ended up 2023 with 782 federated athletes, representing a small growth of 1.2% compared to the previous year. This growth was led by the Paraná Fencing Federation, which has been grown by 22% compared to 2022.

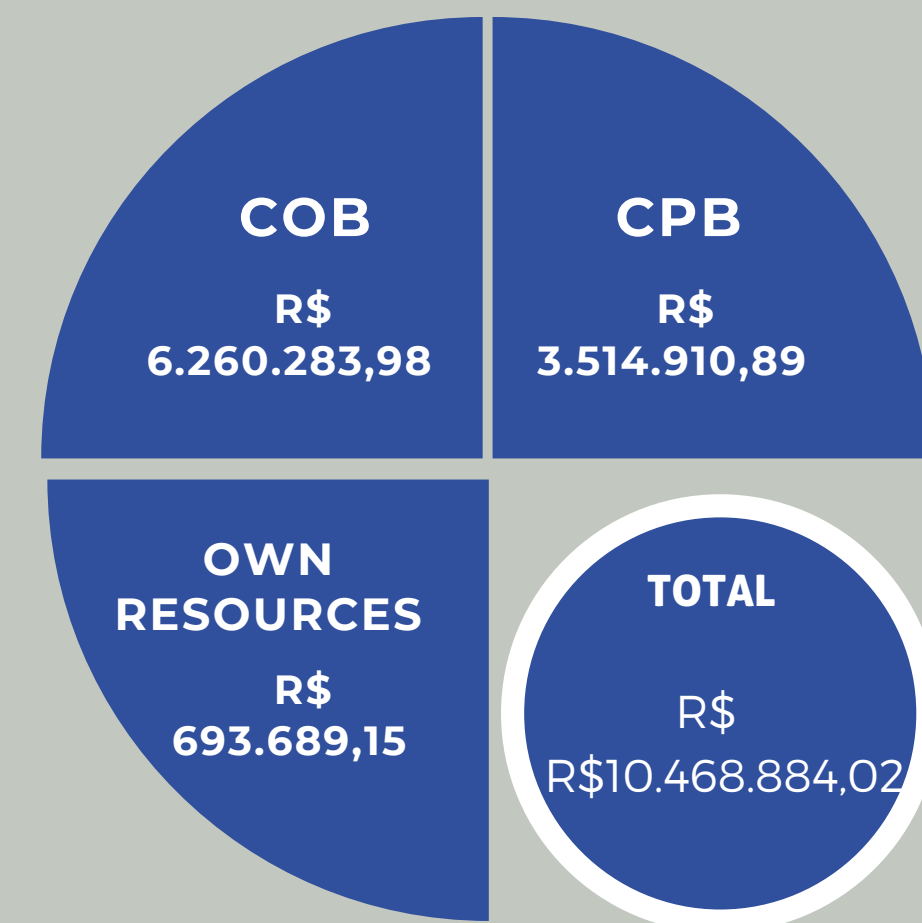
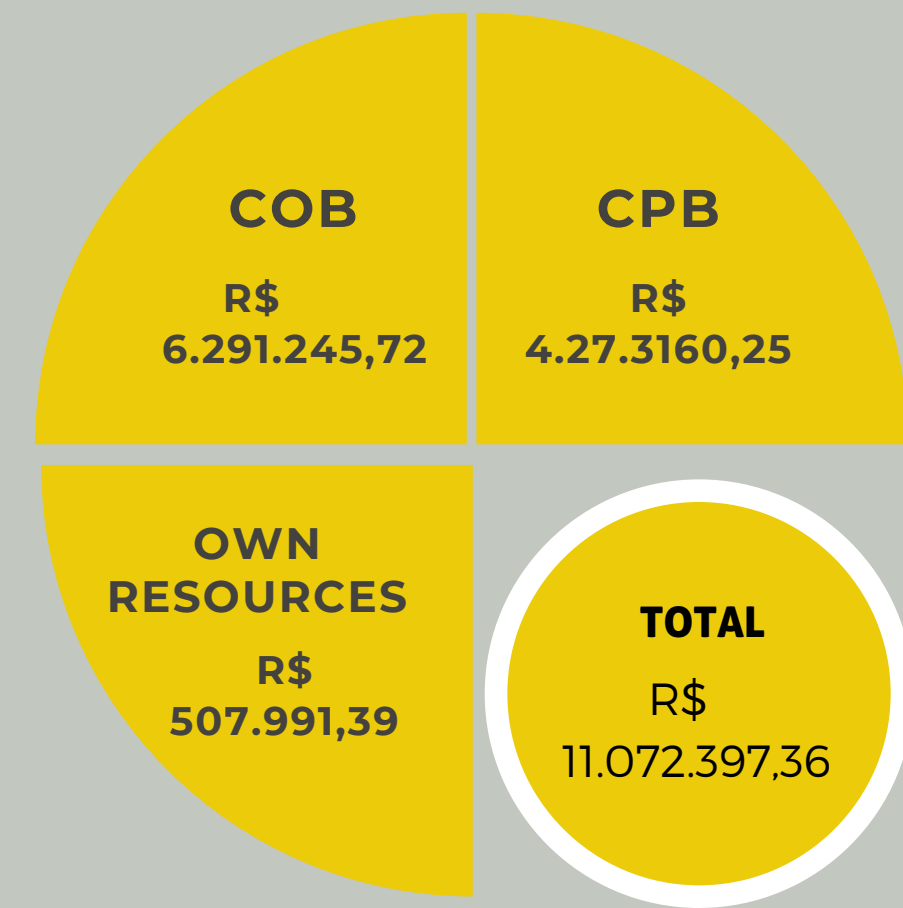
FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

In 2023, CBE's financial flows were as expected. Our main source of income has come from Law 13.756/2018 (Lottery Law), with separate amounts decentralized by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) and the Brazilian Paralympic Committee. In addition, our own resources from fees, annuities, registrations and sponsorships exceeded initial expectations, totaling R\$968,370, slightly down on the previous year.

Throughout the year, CBE move R\$10,468,884.02. Of this amount, R\$5,382,960.73 was used directly to organize or take part in competitions, and an extra R\$197,232.38 was spent on training internships that also involved our young exponents from the grassroots categories. In view of the start of the Olympic season, the CBE used R\$5,580,193.11, equivalent to approximately 53% of the 2023 resources, with a focus on classifying and preparing athletes for the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

In addition, we allocated R\$404,553.23 - representing 3.86% - for the payment of athletes scholarships, in line with, and complementing, the Federal Government's Athlete scholarships Program.

The remaining resources were allocated to various expenses, including operating costs such as rent, internet and telephone services, electricity, water, condominium fees, as well as staff and management costs. We also dedicated resources to promoting the sport, such as promoting the sport of fencing in Belém do Pará, among other initiatives.

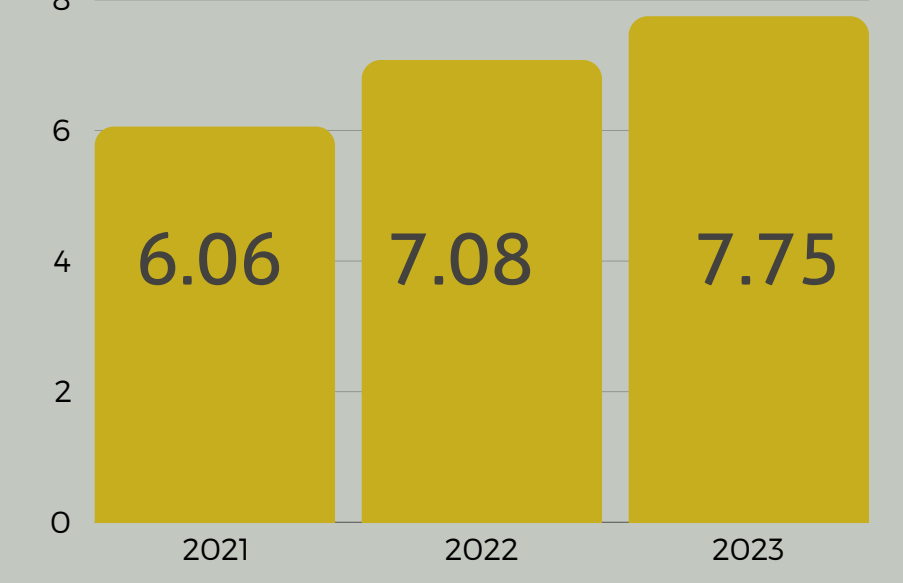
MANAGEMENT, ETHICS AND TRANSPARENCY PROGRAM - THE GET PROGRAM

The Management, Ethics and Transparency Program, a certification seal for good management and governance practices, is an initiative led by the Brazilian Olympic Committee. Based on modern management and business values, it aims to boost Brazilian sport not only as a power within its segment, but as a benchmark in organizational maturity, providing an environment conducive to technical development and the pursuit of high performance.

CBE continues to make progress in its evaluations, demonstrating constant growth in its metrics. Despite having reached a new level of commitment to the program, which naturally brings with it more challenging and complex issues, our trajectory is still rising. We highlight, for example, the following scores over the years: 6.06 (2021), 7.08 (2022) and 7.75 (2023).

We project 2024 as the most challenging year since the start of the program. In December 2023, we were notified of significant changes to the scope of the project. Furthermore, the increase in the number of questions and knowledge areas, there was a significant change in the weights assigned, especially in the “Participation in Competitions” theme, which had its score raised from “2” to “3”. This change certainly encourages us to approach the criteria strategically, prioritizing those that have greater value and require more robust evidence.

We are ready for the challenges that 2024 holds for us.

In 2023, the calendar of competitions organized by CBE in Brazil amounted to 27 competitions. This required an intense operational and logistical effort, only surpassed by the high level of commitment of the lean CBE team.

The international events held also resulted in a high level of satisfaction among those involved and served as a basis of experience for the international competitions we will host in the coming years;



SPORTS RESULTS

This year represented an unprecedented chapter in the history of Brazilian fencing, full of notable achievements in international competitions. Among these achievements, we won three international important medals; two in the Grand Prix and one in the World Cup, all the merit of the exceptional Brazilian fencer Nathalie Moellhausen, culminating in her third position in the FIE international ranking at the end of the year.

These impressive results kicked off our journey towards Olympic qualification, with four athletes with a real chance of getting direct places at the Paris Olympic Games through the world rankings: Nathalie Moellhausen, Guilherme Toldo, Mariana Pistoia and Karina Trois. In addition, the men's foil team also stood out in this scenario, with great chances of winning the desired Olympic qualification.

In South America and Pan American competitions, we were also impressive. At the Pan American Games, Brazilian fencing won four bronze medals, three of which were won in individual events by Guilherme Toldo, Mariana Pistoia in the foil and Alexandre Camargo in the sword, demonstrating the peak of their sporting careers. In addition, our women's épée team reached the top step of the podium, achieving an unprecedented result for Brazil, while the men's foil team won bronze in the competition.



SPORTS RESULTS

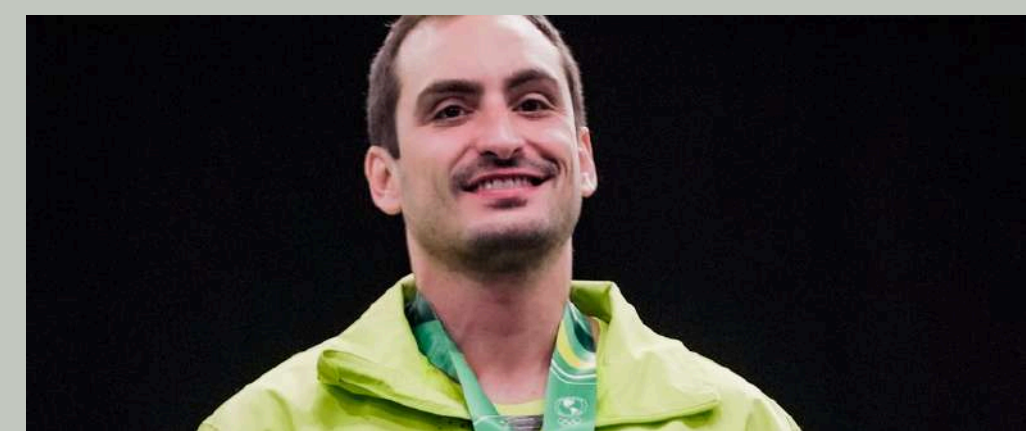
The achievement in Chile has a unique historical value, as it breaks a 48-year hiatus with no men's medals in the sword at the Pan American Games. In addition, it has been 56 years since a man stood on the podium in an individual fencing event - the last one was Arthur Cramer, who won gold in Winnipeg, Canada, in 1967.

Guilherme Toldo made history by winning bronze in the individual foil, his fifth medal in four consecutive editions of the largest multi-sport competition in the Americas. He has equaled Arthur Cramer, the greatest medalist in the history of Brazilian fencing in this competition, also with five medals in four consecutive Pans.

Brazil was also brilliant in the Pan American Fencing Championships in different categories, from youth to veterans, totaling 65 medals in 2023. At the adult Pan American Championships, Brazil won three bronze medals in individual competitions for Nathalie Moellhausen, Guilherme Toldo and Karina Trois, as well as bronze for the Women's Éppée team.

In the Pan American Cadet and Junior Championships, we achieved 19 medals, including three bronze medals in the cadet men's foil and sabre individual events (Erico Patto and Eduardo Gonçalves) and in the junior men's foil (Ricardo Pacheco). The most impressive results came from the Pan American Youth and Veteran Championships, with 39 individual medals: seven gold, eleven silver and 21 bronze, placing Brazil in first place in the overall medal table by country.

At the 2023 South American Championships, in all categories, Brazil accumulated 83 individual medals - 19 gold, 20 silver and 44 bronze. In addition, in the team events, we took first place in the U17 competitions, the Youth Women's Éppée, the Youth Men's and Women's Foil, the Youth Men's and Women's Sabre, and the Adult Men's and Women's Foil, reinforcing our prominent position on the South American scene.



SPORTS RESULTS - WHEELCHAIR FENCING

In the Paralympic season, our efforts were focused on supporting the athletes in their efforts to qualify for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games. As a result, the Paralympic team took part in 9 international IWAS competitions, one of them was the Satellite Tournament held in São Paulo.

Jovane Guissone, a two-time Paralympic medalist, won two bronze medals at the World Cup in Washington in the épée and foil B weapons. At the World Cup in Busan, South Korea, he won another bronze in his main weapon - the épée.

The young Kevin Damasceno stood on the podium for bronze at the U23 Busan World Cup in the sabre A weapon.

In the satellite tournament, the Brazilian delegation won 8 gold, 7 silver and 14 bronze medals.

BRAZILIAN FENCING INSTITUTE - IBE

In 2023, we will be continuing to implement the plans of the Brazilian Fencing Institute (IBE), with the aim of increasing the availability of trained professionals for the market and improving the skills of active technicians. Our goal is to expand the practice of fencing and para-fencing in Brazil even more.

To fully support the course schedule and expand the IBE's initiatives, we have refilled the vacancy by reassigning the employee Rodrigo Fontes to the position of IBE Coordinator, a position which he assumed in 2023.

In 2023, during the Brazilian Championship held at the Grêmio Náutico União venue in Porto Alegre, we held another CBE Hall of Fame ceremony, honoring four new great names in Brazilian fencing.

In the Sports Manager category, we honored **Mr. Gerli dos Santos**, who served as Vice President of the Brazilian Fencing Confederation and was subsequently elected President of the same organization from 2009 to 2017. Internationally, Gerli was Vice President of the Pan-American Fencing Confederation (CPE) between 2012 and 2016 and he was elected a member of the Legal Commission of the International Fencing Federation (FIE).

In the Fencing Master category, a posthumous tribute was paid to **João Antonio da Silva Rosa**, who, as well as being a South American champion sabre player, he was a Fencing Master who was beloved and respected by everyone.

In the Athlete category, the honoree was **Guilherme Toldo**, a Grêmio Náutico União athlete with numerous national and international achievements, including his participation in three Olympic Games,

In the Referee category, the Hall of Fame trophy was presented to **Eduardo Romão Gomes**, Mestre D'Armas, FIE and IWAS international referee, with an extensive professional curriculum that includes the training of a large part of the Brazilian referees' staff.
