All these valiant athletes achieved great results throughout this cycle, with international achievements that made us very proud.

The year of 2024 was also a time of growth and the inauguration of new fencing clubs throughout Brazil, especially in the area of parafencing and with particular attention to the north and northeast of Brazil. We're on the rise and it's clear to see! The national youth competitions are seeing a significant number of fencers, which is giving us a pleasant "headache", considering the difficulty in finding available physical spaces.

On the other hand, at the end of 2024, our very first blended-learning Course for Level-1 Fencing Coaches was finally completed. This initiative will represent undoubtedly such a new and most important of expansion for our sport.

Following the technological bias, the CBE is now developing an app for quick and easy access to the main information on our website. It will be online soon.

In terms of administration and finances, the CBE has never been so well adjusted and dynamic. We have improved a lot in our processes and policies, all of which are published on our website in order to respect the necessary transparency.

The CBE's accountability to the bodies that inspect us is "picture-perfect", which has turned our federation as one of the most regular federations in the ranking on this category.

GOVERNANCY

THE GET PROGRAM MANAGEMENT, ETHICS AND TRANSPARENCY

The main objective of the GET Program is to support Olympic Federations in developing their management and governance processes. It acts as a "road map" in the process of developing an organization's governance, and it has 9 areas of knowledge, where Federations must answer 336 questions and they also have to attach the evidence of compliance.

In the 2024 GET program, the Brazilian Fencing Federation answered 198 of the 281 questions which it had to be answered, with 380 pieces of evidence, confirming its commitment to develop the organization's Strategic Management even more.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

In 2024, the CBE reviewed its Strategic Planning, involving many of its stakeholders in the process to establish new strategic guidelines that will underpin the CBE's activities for the next Olympic cycle.

Among the members of this new CBE Strategic Plan, we can highlight the involvement of the Presidency, directors and employees, as well as members of the athletes' commission and members of the fiscal and administrative board.

TRANSPARENCY - "Sou do Esporte" Award

For the first time, the CBE participated in the 'Sou do Esporte' Award and it was classified to the finals in the "Transparency" category among sports organizations, demonstrating the evolution of the Fencing Federation in its Management and Governance processes.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

The CBE's financial management was in line with expectations for 2024. The main source of income came from the Law 13.756/2018 (Lottery Law), whose amounts are distributed by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) and the Brazilian Paralympic Committee. Also, the partnership with the Brazilian Clubs Committee (CBC), which used to provide assistance with airline tickets and accommodation, it has been temporarily suspended. As this support was provided directly, it wasn't possible to establish mechanisms to guarantee the dates and locations of the CBC's logistical procedures.


In terms of CBE's own funds, which come mainly from fees, annual dues and registrations, the CBE exceeded its initial forecast, raising more than R\$3.1 million, making 2024 the year with the highest own fundraising in the organization's history. This result was mainly generated by the international competitions organized by the CBE, which brought the qualifying race for the 2024 Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games to a conclusion.



CBE's HISTORICAL RECORD



The other 25.79% was distributed in several areas of disbursement, such as expenditures for support activities (the rental bill, internet bill, the phone bill, the electricity bill, the water bill, the employees and managers payment), as well as support for the maintenance of fencing in Belém do Pará, IBE courses and the purchase of new fencing equipments. The CBE has also invested R\$334,000 (5.22%) in grant-aids for athletes, as a supplement of "Bolsa Atleta Program" an iniciative of the Brazilian Federal Government. It was especially for young talents in the youth categories who took part in training internships.

THE BOARD

THE SUPERVISORY BOARD

In 2024, the Fiscal Board had four meetings, with minutes recorded on the following days: 2024, Feb.28th; 2024, Jun.10th; 2024, Jul. 23rd and 2024, Oct. 30th. During the first quarter, the documentation for the 2023 financial year was analyzed, which led to a favorable opinion on the CBE's accounts for that year.

At the first meeting, on February 28th, topics were discussed, various including the definition of the regular meeting schedule for the following period. All the meetings have been held by remote connection, with the participation of the Financial Supervisor, Alefer Santos, who has monitored the demands closely and clarified any doubts raised by the board members.

THE ETHICS BOARD

The Ethics Board, which is composed of its President, Heros Lobo, and the Board Members, Suzana Pasternak and Gerson Galleazzi, perfomed in few situations during 2024.

The CBE provides its internal affairs service through the Digital internal affairs platform.

The strengthened activities of the Supervisory Board are in line with CBE's financial policy, which adopts the practice of quarterly balance reports, accompanied by independent audit opinions. This approach aims to guarantee the transparency and credibility of CBE's financial reports, making it possible to periodically ratify the results and provide the board with its final opinion.



THE ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD

The CBE's Management Board performed its duties throughout 2024. In June, following a convocation from the President, Ildefonso Petrich, a collegiate meeting was held to assess the request for recognition of the Poços de Caldas Association of the Physically Handicapped (EPP). The Council decided in favor of granting recognition to the entity.

On September 6th, a new meeting was held to monitor strategic planning, analyzing the metrics for the first half of the year. After a presentation by the departments, the collegiate concluded that CBE was in compliance with the established program, and there was no need to revise the objectives at that time.

Continuing with management, on November 6th, 2024, another meeting of the Management Board was held to evaluate the year. On that occasion, CBE President Ricardo Machado proposed a review of the strategic pillars, covering management, education and culture, sports development, high sports performance, image and engagement.

After presentations by directors Rosele Sanchotene, José Santucci and Arno Schneider (Technical Director and Vice-President), the Committee approved the financial year, with the recommendation to reformulate the plan for the new four-year cycle 2025 to 2028.



THE ATHLETE COMMITTEE

The CBE Athletes' Commission is composed by the President Guilherme Toldo and the following members: Fabio Lemes, Henrique Garrigós, Karina Trois, Nayara Ferreira da Silva, Silvia Rothfeld, Rayssa Veras and Clodoaldo Zafatoski, representing all fencing and para-fencing disciplines.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

The Brazilian Fencing Federation (CBE) itself is an end-oriented institution, meaning that its actions are strategically planned to achieve the best sporting results. To make this possible, an efficient administrative structure is essential to support all the planning and execution of activities.

In the last financial year, our athletes participated significantly in official International Fencing Federation (FIE) competitions, especially in the first half of the year. This phase was divided into two distinct periods: between January and May, focused on qualifying for the Games, and between May and September, dedicated to preparation, including training internships in Brazil and abroad.

This effort resulted in our top athletes taking part in almost 30 competitions on the world circuit and 10 training internships sessions. In the end, we qualified 10 athletes for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games, 7 at the Paralympic Games and 3 at the Olympic ones, who represented the Brazilian fencing with great excellence.


Due to the significant increase in activities, it was necessary to increase the number of employees. In February 2024, we hired the Federation's intern Klécio Amorim, who has shown such an excellent performance and growth in his duties. In addition, we identified the need to hire another professional to help with Paralympic and Olympic activities, especially due to the maternity leave of one of our employees. In July, Marcelly Guimarães joined the administration team.

Administrative activities also played an essential role in organizing the calendar of national events. Various tournaments, championships and cups were held, both national and international ones. The logistical challenges were significant, as the events took place in different regions of the country, including the South, Southeast and Northeast. Unfortunately, a weather catastrophe in April and May forced us to cancel a competition in Porto Alegre. Despite the difficulties, we managed the situation quickly and efficiently.

We continue to improve our administrative policies, processes and procedures. Most of these documents have undergone periodic reviews for adjustments and improvements, thus ensuring greater efficiency and compliance. The new versions have been completed and appropriately republished.

The GET Program (Management, Ethics and Transparency) has been updated in its scope, expanding areas of knowledge, diversifying topics and exploring issues in greater depth. For the second year running, the CBE remained in the category 3, with an annual income of around R\$9 million to R\$12 million, requiring it to fulfill the level 3 requirements.

The Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) has kept up its support program for affiliates, providing up to R\$200,000.00 for various activities. The CBE made use of these funds as follows:



2024 was also a year of reassurance. In addition to the CBE's consolidation in The GET Program, recognized as a reference for good practices in management and governance, we strengthened our partnership with The Brazilian Olympic Committee through the renewed participation in the "Esporte Seguro Program". This commitment aims to guarantee a safe sporting environment for everyone, promoting a culture of prevention, recognition and dealing with inappropriate situations, in accordance with the current legislation.

The year of 2024 was a challenging one, but also a year of great achievements. We remain determined to strengthen Brazilian fencing and ensure an increasingly professional, transparent and inclusive environment for everyone involved in the sport.


FEDERATIONS, EPDs, EPPs AND ATHLETES



SPORTS RESULTS Fencing



The 2024 was a year of remarkable campaigns for Brazil in fencing, with Mariana Pistoia's victory at the Pre-Olympic Championships, which guaranteed her vacancy at the 2024 Olympics Games, and the exceptional performance at the Pre-Cadet, Cadet and Junior South American Championships. In this competition, Brazil won a total of 35 medals (10 golds, 11 silvers and 14 bronzes), exceeding the sum of the medals of the 2nd-placed country and 3rd-placed one too, which received 18 medals altogether.

SPORTS RESULTS: Wheelchair fencing

In 2024, there was a record number of participants in Brazilian Wheelchair fencing, with more athletes, Fencing Practice Entities (EPPs), cities and states represented. At the Brazilian Wheelchair Fencing Championships, 67 athletes competed (30 women and 37 men), exceeding the previous record of 65. The event involved 13 EPPs from seven states.

We want to highlights the expansion of the Brazilian Northeast Region, with Ceará (ADEFIP) and Alagoas (A.A.A.) taking an active part, and the Brazilian Northern Region including Pará (ADFPA). Two new organizations have joined in competitions: Esgrima Mestre Pereira and Associação dos Deficientes Físicos de Poços de Caldas (ADEFIP).

The Wheelchair Fencing had an annual budget of R\$1,412,775.00 in 2024, in addition to R\$1,344,000.00 allocated to 18 projects approved by the Extra Promotion and Development Funding.

PROJECTS IN DEVELOPMENT:

- Parafencing School Project: It attended 25 athletes giving fencing classes in the Fencing Hall of the Paralympic Training Center.
- "Reabilitar para o Esporte" Project: 9 athletes took part in the National Competition and also in the International one, including the selection of Sabrina Marques for the U-17/23 World Championship in Thailand and the participation of Lucas Julião and Renato Santana in the Americas Zone Championship.



INTERNATIONALS CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The Brazilian athletes achieved important international results.

2024 PARIS PARALYMPIC GAMES: Six Brazilian athletes took part: Jovane Guissone, Monica Santos, Vanderson Chaves, Rayssa Veras, Lenilson Oliveira and Kevin Damasceno took part and achieved significant positions in individual and team categories too. And the best result was for Jovane Guissone, who took 5th place in Épée B.

CLASSES AND TRAININGS:

Brazil has strengthened its training in Wheelchair fencing by promoting national and international courses in partnership with the Brazilian Paralympic Committee.

- Basic Training Course for Coaches: The event was held in the cities of Rio de Janeiro, Blumenau, Macapá and Manaus, and it trained 50 new wheelchair fencing coaches.
- America-Africa International Course: The course was attended by trainings and athletes from 8 countries promoting technical exchange and the development of the activity. It was organized by the CBE at the Paralympic Training Center

After a year of records and progress, the Brazilian Wheelchair Fencing keeps growing, consolidating its position on the national and international scene. The results obtained reflect the high level and dedication of Brazilian athletes, consolidating Brazil's position in continental fencing.



2024 CBE HIGHLIGHTS AWARDS

The CBE awards the athletes who have achieved outstanding results in their weapons/categories, who are in first place in the national rankings and who also have the best positions in the FIE and WAS international rankings. In addition to the athletes, the referees of each weapon who are best evaluated by the athletes, coaches and the Refereeing Commission are also recognized. The sports organization with the maximum number of winners receives its medal and the medal of the best coach - chosen by the members of the winning sports organization.

MARKETING and COMMUNICATION

2024 was a very positive year for CBE in terms of brand awareness and communication with the Confederation's stakeholders.

Our website has been completely redesigned, adding greater modernity and usability for the fencing community. We have been developing an App that will provide greater convenience and agility in accessing relevant information, in line with the CBE's commitment to transparency and getting closer to its stakeholders.

We maintained our sponsors - Espaço Laser, Skintec, Olikk and Strix Capital, which gave us the opportunity to invest more in uniforms and marketing activities such as CBEsgrima TV.

CBEsgrima TV broadcast live the 18 competitions held by the CBE in Brazil. We also broadcast the Adult Brazilian Interclub Championship and the Cadet National Tournament on the Time Brasil YouTube channel. As well as meeting a demand from our athletes and their families, CBEsgrima TV's broadcasts are allowing CBE to be present in various locations in Brazil and abroad.

In 2024 we launched the CBE's first projects under the Sports Incentive Law, with a focus on holding two major international competitions that will take place in Brazil in 2025 and 2026, which will further strengthen fencing worldwide.

The Pan-American Adult Championships will be held in June 2025 and the Cadet and Youth World Championships in 2026, both at the Carioca 1 Arena, Barra Olympic Park.









As part of our Institutional Partnerships, we took part in Expo COB and Expo Brasil Paralímpico, events promoted by the Brazilian Olympic Committee (COB) and the Brazilian Paralympic Committee (CPB). Expo COB stood out as the first initiative of the Olympic movement to bring together managers, athletes, former athletes, industry, practitioners and fans of sport in the same space, boosting all the disciplines. The Paralympic Brazil Expo aimed to strengthen inclusion and accessibility, promoting diversity and building a fairer and more equitable society.

















THE CBE's HALL OF FAME

In 2024, we will honor new figures from the history of Brazilian fencing with the Hall of Fame Trophy, created in 2019.

In this edition, we celebrate the victorious careers of two Olympic athletes who inspire many: João Antônio Albuquerque e Souza and Roberto Lazzarini, as well as Sports Director Silvio Dadia Sampaio, President of the Rio Grande do Sul Fencing Federation, former athlete and coach.

João Souza, as he is known, was a foil athlete for Grêmio Náutico União, and had a remarkable career, representing Brazil at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing and winning the bronze medal at the 2007 Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro, an achievement that broke a 32-year medal drought in fencing.





Roberto Lazzarini is one of the most decorated athletes in the history of Brazilian fencing, beginning his journey in 1974 under the guidance of the renowned Master Buonafina. He won his first Brazilian championship in the children's category in 1976 and led the Brazilian foil ranking for 11 consecutive years from 1982.

Silvio Dadia Sampaio is a central figure in the history of fencing in Rio Grande do Sul. Born on December 16, 1951, in Passo Fundo, Silvio is а multifaceted professional, with a career marked by discipline and leadership, both in the military and in sports. He was an athlete and fencing coach and is the President of the Rio Grande do Sul Fencing Confederation.





BRAZILIAN FENCING INSTITUTE - IBE

The Brazilian Fencing Institute – IBE, created in the year of the RIO 2016 Olympic Games, is the Educational Department of the Brazilian Fencing Confederation, focused on the training and qualification of human resources, as well as the diffusion and dissemination of fencing in Brazil.

Its objectives, in summary, are based on three fundamental pillars:

- Training sports professionals through its various technical COURSES;
- Promote scientific research in sport, promote diverse EVENTS for professionals and athletes.
- Spread and disseminate fencing, providing, as a facilitating agent, the opening of its market through various actions such as PROJETO ENGAJAR.

In March, IBE Coordinator Rodrigo Fontes completed the "Coach Developer" course, promoted by the Brazilian Olympic Committee. In the same month, a mentoring program was launched in partnership with the COB to create the Level II Coaching Course for the three fencing weapons, which included a detailed survey of the profile of coaches working in Brazil.

We held the Level I Coaching Course in Rio de Janeiro, in collaboration with the Ginásio Educacional Olímpico (GEO), resulting in the training of eight new coaches, two women and six men.

In May, the same course was offered in the city of Pilar, Alagoas, in partnership with the local Department of Education. During this training, a kit from the Engajar Project was made available, enabling the creation of the "Toque de Classe" project, which benefited 200 students from the municipal school system. At the end of the course, 14 coaches were trained, including three women and 11 men.

The IBE also supported several hubs of the Engajar Project throughout the year in the Northeast region (Alagoas and Recife), South (Paraná) and Southeast (Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo) ones.








Focused on promoting female participation in our sport, the CBE promoted a Training Internship for Coaches with the objective of training and strengthening the performance of the 14 female coaches who work in the Sports Practice Entities (EPDs). This initiative sought to promote gender equality in fencing and encourage female participation in national teams; currently, two female coaches are part of the technical staff of the Brazilian youth teams.

In September was the start of the construction of content for the Distance Learning Platform (EAD), with the recording of videos for the Level I Trainers Course, which will allow the training of new professionals through a hybrid model.

In October, another Level I Coaching Course was held in the city of Recife, resulting in the training of 15 new coaches, five men and ten women. In the same month, there was participation in the 4th Sports Development Workshop, a fundamental event for the elaboration of the strategic planning for 2025.

Furthermore, after the measurement of the Sports Monitoring System (SPLISS) carried out by the Brazilian Olympic Committee, there was a significant increase in the budget allocated to the youth categories, which went from R\$241,000.00 to R\$458,000.00. This increase represents an important step forward in strengthening the sports base and consolidating the development of fencing in the country.


